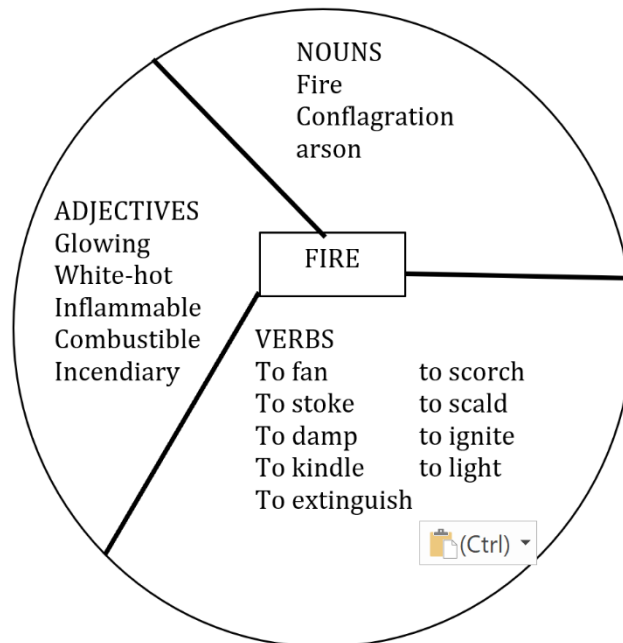




VOCABULARY CIRCLE



The words are arranged in the sectors according to the work they do. In one sector are nouns. These are the naming words. In the second sector are adjectives, i.e., describing words. In the third are verbs, i.e., doing words. Many of the words can do different work, so they could appear in another sector. ("Damp", for instance, could be written in all three sectors. Why?) Sometimes, though, their shape changes slightly. ("Ignite", for example, becomes "ignition" if it moves from the verb to the noun sector.) Can you suggest any other possible moves?

You can create a few more sectors in the circle and include synonyms and antonyms too for the word.

This is an example of the vocabulary circle that is used in our English lessons to help improve the student's vocabulary.



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
